PROGRAMS & EVENTS

- o The Days in the Arts (DARTS) program is a summer residential program near Tanglewood that provides middle school students with a high-quality arts immersion experience, allowing each student to engage with and create art with their peers in a positive, non-judgmental environment.
- o The Tanglewood Family Concert provides an engaging and educational concert experience especially geared for children ages 3-8 and their families at Ozawa Hall during the Tanglewood season. The family concert is designed to engage and inspire new generations of children through music and programs for young audiences.
- Watch and Play, sponsored by the Boston Symphony
 Association of Volunteers, is an interactive musical performance designed to engage children ages 3-10 in the Tanglewood musical experience.
- As one of the foremost arts organizations in the country,
 The BSO has used its stature to develop, nurture and
 strengthen ties with surrounding communities. Additional
 events include One Day University, Talks and Walks,
 Family Fun Fest, Berkshire Nights, and more.

- o <u>Tanglewood Music Center</u> presents a unique opportunity for a summer of living and working in music. The Music Center is designed to lay special emphasis upon those aspects of musical education concerned with collective performance. It will thus supplement rather than duplicate the training available in the established schools of music.
- The BSO Archives houses printed programs, press clippings, posters, photographs, administrative files, letters, and an extensive collection of radio broadcast tapes of concerts and commercial recordings, dating back to 1881.
