- After opening in Western Gateway Heritage State Park building 1, the Society received many generous loans and donations of artifacts. This collection overfilled their next home in building 2. In February 1999 it was decided to change the name from the Local History Center to the North Adams Local History Museum. The exhibits have increased in size and number of artifacts and the membership continues to grow. In May 2001, they became the North Adams Museum of History and Science and moved to building 5A where we have over 25 permanent exhibits on three floors.
