The Mount is a National Historic Landmark and cultural center that celebrates the intellectual, artistic, and humanitarian legacy of Edith Wharton. The Mount engages a diverse audience by providing context to Wharton's life and achievements through their interpretive and public programs, and preservation of her historic estate.

#### **PROGRAMS & EVENTS**

Year-round programming reflects Wharton's love of culture and the arts and includes live storytelling events, theater, music, and the popular Monday Lecture Series.

- Tours of the house and gardens, a Backstairs Tour, and the popular Ghost Tour are offered to tell the stories of The Mount. There are no velvet ropes and stanchions, instead visitors are invited to sit and interact with the rooms. Interpretive exhibits throughout the house explore Wharton's life, her humanitarian efforts, literary legacy, and lives of the servants.
- School Visits: Tours and programs are open to K-12 students and are available year round. Mount educators are also available to bring Wharton's gilded world to your classroom.
- <u>Writers-in-Residence Program</u>: Two and three week residencies are offered each March for three women poet, fiction, or creative nonfiction writers. The principal responsibility of each resident is to spend time further developing her creative work. Each residency is scheduled so that there is some overlap between the writers. This "mini" writers' colony will give the residents a community of support and camaraderie.
- Music After Hours: Every weekend in July and August from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. the Mount hosts lively evenings of free music played by the region's most talented musicians.
