Both the field trip program and resource kit meet the Massachusetts frameworks for History and Social Science, English Language Arts, and Science and Technology/Engineering.

PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

- Field Trip Program: Growing up in the Massachusetts Hinterland, A Sampler of Daily Life in Early America. The Bidwell House Museum field trip program explores the everyday experiences of children in Western Massachusetts during the Colonial/Early Republic time periods through hands-on, minds-on engagement with historic buildings, objects, and landscapes.
- o Internships for High School Students: The Bidwell House Museum offers high school students with an interest in history, particularly local Berkshire colonial history, the opportunity to become a Young History Scholar Intern during the summer. High school interns spend two weeks at the museum: in week one the intern learns about colonial Berkshire history, the Bidwell family, the house, the property and the collection, and how docents give tours; in week two each intern chooses a research topic and begins to give tours of the museum as a junior docent.
- o Group Visits: Travel a country mile to the 18th century.
- Guided Tours: The Bidwell House Museum offers guided tours of the house and grounds, Thursday Monday throughout the season.
 - On the **House Tour**, visitors will learn about the history of the house, the story Bidwell family and life in the 18th century Berkshire Hills.
 - o On the **Family Tour**, visitors will learn about the Bidwell House and what it would have been like to have been a child in the house in the 18th century; children are invited to ask questions, make observations and participate in two easy activities.
 - o On the **Woodland Walk**, join guide Rob Hoogs to explore a new interpretive trail that retraces the steps of the Native Americans—specifically the local Stockbridge Band of the Mohican Tribe—who lived and hunted in this area for thousands of years.
