YOUR DEGREE AUDIT



Congratulations on your acceptance to MCLA! We are committed to making the transfer process simple and seamless. After reviewing your transcript(s), we have put together a unique degree audit to show you how your previously earned credit transfer to MCLA.

"In progress" courses cannot be officially added to your Degree Audit until the course has been completed and graded. Once MCLA receives a final transcript, your "in progress" courses will be added.

As a reminder, MCLA will accept a maximum of 75 credits. Credits earned must be a C- or better and IOO level or higher. MassTransfer credits of D or better will be accepted.

WHAT IS A DEGREE AUDIT?

- A degree audit is a description of how credits are accepted from your prior institution(s) and what credits are still needed to graduate from MCLA.
- As an MCLA student, you will use your degree audit to plan your academic opportunities. It breaks down core and major requirements to ensure that you are on track towards graduation.

HOW MANY CREDITS IS MCLA ACCEPTING?

- Your degree audit will show you how many credits we are accepting in the "Student View" section under "Transfer Hours." Note: this number does not include "in progress" courses.
- The two degree progress bars indicate the percentage completed towards <u>all MCLA</u> graduation REQUIREMENTS and the percentage of CREDITS you have completed towards the overall I2O credits needed.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE REQUIREMENTS AT MCLA

The first section of your degree audit shows overall requirements to earn a Bachelor's Degree at MCLA. Most likely, this section will not be completed until your final semester at MCLA.

All MCLA students must complete these requirements, including physical education credits and a core curriculum. The core curriculum has three tiers: Core Foundations, Core Domains, and Capstone Experience. These must all be completed in order to graduate.

MAJOR/MINOR/CONCENTRATION REQUIREMENTS

These requirements are specific to your course of study. Please contact the Office of Admission if you'd like to change your major.

UPPER LEVEL COURSEWORK

In order to be eligible for graduation, you must complete 39 upper level courses. Courses numbered 300 or higher are upper level.

FALLTHROUGH COURSES

These are courses that you have taken at a prior institution that do no directly apply to your degree requirement. The credit will still count towards the I2O credits needed to graduate.
