## 2020-2021 Syllabus and Schedule Pittsfield Public Schools Induction Program Year One and Two Combined

New Educator Orientation (NEO/NTO) and the <u>first year</u> of New Educator Induction (NEI/NTI) are <u>required</u> by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and your contract with the district. The second year of induction is optional but must be completed in order to advance your educator license.

Pittsfield has decided to restructure its induction programming this year to accommodate the large number of new educators and the variety of needs. The sessions outlined below are aligned to Research for Better Teaching curriculum and district priorities and policies. Educators may choose the sessions that would be most helpful to their current needs and interests.

<u>First-Year Educators<sup>1</sup></u>: You must attend all mandatory sessions. You must also attend a minimum of 5 additional sessions of your choosing. You may attend additional sessions.

<u>Second-Year Educators</u><sup>2</sup>: To complete the required number of hours, you must attend a minimum of 8 sessions of your choosing. You may attend additional sessions.
